I hate the very thought of doing it. Also, I do not know how Bellview is going to react to Trish and the kids not coming here to Singapore. I do not know what Billy [Bland] and Curtis are going to think either. Trish and I are just going to walk away from the situation here and come home. If you will, please keep your eyes open for a full-time work for us. If it has a house or a good salary that we could afford to rent and get insc, this would be great. Also, we want to be by a college where Trish can finish her nursing degree so she will be able to provide our benefits in the future. She only has a couple of years to go in order to get her RN. Sorry for the delay in responding. I had a bit of a problem with my internet connection for awhile and I couldn't send or receive e-mail. The lectureship at Calhoun went well, and was well attended. I may have told you that they asked me to speak in the place of Barry Gilreath, Jr., whom they uninvited week before last because of the Highland Congregation's (Dalton) endorsement of Dave Miller. B.J. was supposed to have come straight from talking with D. Miller at the "Pol. the Pul." thing to Calhoun. As it turns out, Miller was gone by the time he got there, so he didn't even see him. Either B.J. neglected to tell Miller he wanted to visit with him, or he told him and he skipped town. At any rate, 2 or 3 of us talked with B.J. a bit about it. He spoke Thursday night and had to leave Friday morning so he could begin a meeting yesterday in Mammoth Spring, AR. He told me (and others) that he planned to get Miller on his cell phone and visit with him while traveling Fri. The Northside elders met with B.J. Thur. night for at least an hour, expressing their concern to him that he not let Miller hedge or deceive him. I fear (as I detected the Northside elders do at least somewhat) that B.J. so badly wants to hold hands with MSOP, Forest Hill, and Getwell that he is really dragging his feet on the matter. I have seen a couple of e-mail messages from B.J. in the past two weeks (one to Kent Bailey and one to Lynn Parker), which he signed, "Yours for truth and peace." I don't like the implications of that wording, as if he alone desires those things. I hope that Ted might have some influence on him while he's in Mammoth Spring this week. Ted told me right after Power Lect. that he told B.J. he should cancel out of the "Pol. the Pul." commitment because Miller was on it. Ted was not aware that I had told him the same thing, telling him he would be sending the wrong message, even if he talked to Miller while there. Obviously, B.J. didn't listen to either of us.

The Northside elders decided last week to approach Miller themselves, and they asked W. Simons to make the approach. They wanted to talk with Miller by phone, with all three elders, D. Smith, and Wesley in on the conversation, and they wanted to tape it. Miller refused when Wesley called him, but he agreed to write a meaningless statement that he was sorry for any Scripture he may have violated or practice he had followed in error, or something similar. The elders asked Wesley, K. Bailey, C. Newell, D. Smith and me to meet with them Sat. at the lunch break. The elders asked Wesley to call Miller again, stating that such an ambiguous statement was unacceptable because it evinced no repentance

and corrected nothing. They want Wesley to write some T/F questions, submit them to the elders for review, then call Miller again. If he will not answer them, the Northside elders said they felt like they will have gone beyond what is necessary regarding Miller, and will be convinced that he does not intend to repent. Oh, for more elders like these guys. Keep the above info to yourself. I hope I have misjudged B.J. and that he will eventually come down in the right place.

I will make some comments (in red, all caps) on the preacher's list and attach it to this reply. Unfortunately, I don't know much about many of them. I'll stay on the lookout for you.

It is good to hear from you and we appreciate the contacts you have sent to us. We have been as busy as a one armed paper hanger for the last several days and I have not been able to keep up with the emailing. I helped my mother move to Maryville and we have been going back and forth from Crossville to here in W.Tenn.

Yes, I tried out there last week [North Cobb, GA]. One of the elders told me that Andy was one of his close friends. I told him that I went to school with Andy at FHU in 87 and that he was a fine man. He knew of what has been happening with you and hates that you have been treated the way you have. It is a good congregation even though they have just gone through an upheaval.
